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EDITORIAL

The Realização Journal organizing team, within the Pro-Rectorate of Extension and Culture/PROEC, is pleased to share another issue containing important articles with results from extension actions.

Realização is a journal created in 2014, completing 10 years of circulation in 2024. 10 years of multidisciplinary knowledge exchange. 10 years being a space and stage for different voices to present their ideas, concerns, and research. 10 years of valuing scientific knowledge, so attacked and discredited in recent times. Here this knowledge is precious.

To celebrate this date at its height, the 21st issue of Realização Journal is presented. This moment requires celebration, since throughout these years there have been countless university extension experiences published every semester, totaling two annual volumes. In them, it is possible to find articles from different areas of knowledge, publicizing results and exchanging knowledge, the main goal of university extension, which seeks to bring academia closer to society. With this feeling of celebration, the present issue is added, containing the following articles:

The first article, authored by GONZAGA, M. G. da S. et al. titled **Extension Project "Where Does It Come From?": Actions and Active Methodologies in Food Technology Teaching**, presents information about the food production chain, especially those of animal origin, leading the population to understand the processes through which these products go through until they reach consumers' tables.

The second article, authored by LEONEL, F. S. et al., with the title **Rural Extension with a Focus on Optimizing Animal Nutrition: Case Study on Practice and Additives to Cattle Production in Mato Grosso do Sul.**, analyzes the work of veterinary professionals involved with animal nutrition, in the municipalities of Anaurilândia, Douradina and Nioaque, in Mato Grosso do Sul, understanding the management of animals aiming at the optimization of production and its profitability.

For this, the study considered the use of additives, technical guidance for appropriate practices and the combination of technology in animal nutrition.

The third article, authored by ANDRADE, W. da P. et al., entitled **Supervised Internship: The Relationship Between Theory and Reflective Practice in the Training of Future Agronomists**, reflects on the internship stage in the training of future agronomists. For this, it analyzes a case study in a company, understanding the accumulation of agronomic competence and skills in dealing with corn cultivation, evaluating "growth, cultural practices and monitoring of pests and diseases aimed at increasing productivity per hectare, allowing greater profit".

The fourth chapter, authored by dos SANTOS, D. C. M. et al., with the title **Curricular Analysis of the Face-to-Face Courses of the Federal University of Grande Dourados (UFGD): An Approach on the Insertion and Obligatoriness of the Themes of Gender Identity and Sexuality**, presents analyses on the Pedagogical Projects of the undergraduate courses of UFGD, understanding in how many of them there are contents that deal with gender identity and/or sexuality, important themes in the "training of professionals and in the construction of the anti-prejudice figure". Of the "34 courses analyzed, nine do not include subjects that deal with these themes, and for the 25 courses that do, the representativeness is low, since of the 2324 subjects, only 60 of them involve these contents".

The fifth chapter, authored by ANDRADE, W. da P. et al., with the title, **Insertion Of Agronomy and Animal Science Course Students in Bovine Slaughterhouses, in Mato Grosso do Sul, Directs Learning: A Rural Extension Perspective**, analyzes the elements that allow professional growth in the internship stage, for students of Agronomy and Animal Science, involved with beef production in "properties and in bovine slaughterhouses, providing experiences improving knowledge about beef cattle, animal nutrition, sanitary management, slaughter and meat quality".

The sixth article, authored by da SILVA, S. T. L. with the title **University Extension and Film Distribution - A Reflection on the "Plot" Project**, consists of a report on the "creation and development of the extension project 'Film Distribution: Curation, festivals, production and audience design', developed at the Federal University of Mato Grosso, training professionals in national film production.

The seventh article, authored by ROSSET, C. de V. et al., entitled **Mental Health of People in Oncological Treatment Accompanied by a Support Association: An Experience Report of Medical Academics**, presents experiences of the Medicine course with people in oncological treatment in Rio Grande do Sul, highlighting the importance of "humanization and the valorization of the individualities of users promoted through the creation of bonds, the stimulation of socialization and the development of dynamic and creative activities that promote mental health".

The set of articles that make up this issue of *Realização*, express the commitment to university extension, first in the initiative of the authors to propose and carry out actions that produce improvement in people's lives and, second, in the act of sharing the results, presented in the sequence of chapters, making the ideas circulate and spread, the essential purpose of the *Realização* Journal.
